My Friends,

When God is left out of the picture and our society becomes more secular, respect for the dignity of the human person suffers. Our faith professes that we are created in God's image. Without debating the moment a 'fetus' becomes human, we believe that from the moment of conception we are to cherish this life as a gift from God. I don't understand how people want to jail someone for abusing an animal and yet demand the right to tear a child from its mother's womb. As much as we would like to resolve this problem in the courts, we have a much more profound problem that needs addressing. Until we can affect a change of heart that calls forth love for the 'other,' we will continue to be victims of our fears. We will demand guns to defend ourselves. We will assert the rights over my body with no thought of another human being. We will build walls to protect ourselves from the stranger. These currents in our society all run counter to the gospel. We are called to love God in our neighbor and the beauty of creation around us.

This week we have two events going on in the diocese to raise our consciousness on these issues. On January 22nd, the anniversary of *Roe v Wade*, Bishop Lennon is celebrating a Mass 4 Life at 10am at St. John's Cathedral. We can assist through our prayers those who will be attending the march in Washington D.C. As we pray for this change of heart, he encourages you to walk through the Door of Mercy into the cathedral. Then on Saturday, January 24th, Bishop Lennon will celebrate a 12 noon Mass at St. Michael Church on Scranton Road in observance of Pope Francis' call to prayer on the World Day of Migrants and Refugees. (Again check the parish bulletin board for more information.)

We will begin the week by hosting an **Open House** on Sunday, **January 31, 2016** from 10:30am to 1:00pm. All are invited to attend, especially those considering the education of their children. Come meet our teachers, tour our buildings and learn about our challenging curriculum in a Christ-centered environment. Our school enrolls children in kindergarten - grade 8. We also offer a half and full day preschool program for 3 and 4 year olds.

Registration for the 2016-2017 school year for Preschool, Kindergarten and NEW students to St. Mary School will begin Sunday, Jan. 31st, from 10:30am-1pm during our School Open House. Registration will take place in the school office. Students new to St. Mary School must bring the following documentation: Birth Certificate, Baptismal Certificate (if not Baptized at St. Mary), Records of First Communion and First Reconciliation (if applicable), Immunization records, Legal custody papers (if applicable) and Registration fee of \$150 [\$50 at time of registration on or before Mar. 8th with remainder due May 16th - nonrefundable - Registration fee increases to \$200 if down payment not made by 3/8/16.] A student registering for Kindergarten must be 5 years old by September 30, 2016. Registration will be considered complete when Parish registration has been verified and the school office has received all materials and fees.
