My Friends,

This year, Pope Francis encourages us to reflect on and recognize the importance of religious life for the good of the Church. His exhortation throughout the year is to Wake Up the World! If I were in another parish, I would need three staff persons to carry out the ministry she provides to everyone from our children to senior citizens. Many of you know Sr. Joan Tomchey, an Ursuline sister, if you have spent any time in the hospital. The work continues on but there are fewer to carry it out.

This weekend we celebrate the freedom that is ours as a nation. We are truly blessed. Unfortunately, we think of freedom as doing whatever we want to do when we want to do it. That is why we need so many laws to protect the rights of each other. True freedom comes in Christ. It is an act of total self-giving in love for another. Rather than demanding our rights, we find our joy in serving the other. Pope Francis is right. It is time to Wake Up the World!
