My Friends,

Happy Father's Day to all of our fathers. Today we not only congratulate you but we also pray for you. These are difficult times for fatherhood. If the 'family' is a critical building block for a healthy society, 'fatherhood' is a critical anchor for holding a family together. While it is always dangerous to generalize, it seems to me that men are more often the ones who are quicker to abandon their commitment. The culture certainly condones and encourages it.

It was the men's spirituality group, Promise Keepers, that operated under the assumption that if they got the men to come to church, the wives and children would be there also. I still think it is a fair assumption. Where do we look for models or mentors for our young men today? They are hard to find whether it be in the sports' world, music, politics, even the church. If we allow cynicism to take over, the anchor is gone.

We need to honor and support those who are faithful to their call of fatherhood. We need to pray and encourage those who are struggling in this role. We need to find mentors who will be there for our young people as they struggle to discern and pursue in their lives what is truly manly. It seems to me that if there were a strong fatherly presence at home, there would not be gangs of young men roaming the streets using guns to prove their manhood.

Vacation is an opportune time to strengthen family relationships. They create memories that last a lifetime. Faith and marriage are the keys to a healthy society. May God, the Father, be the mentor and source of grace for all of our fathers as they strive to be faithful to their call.


