My Friends,

There was a father who came home from work one evening tired and wanting a few moments of quiet to rest. His son greeted him at the door excited to see him and wanting to do something with him. The father saw a picture of the world on a page in a magazine. He tore it into pieces and told his son to put the pieces of the world back together again. He just settled into his chair when his son said he was done. The father could not believe how quickly he finished the puzzle. The son explained that on the other side of the page was a picture of a man. When he put the picture of the man together, the map of the world came together.

When working with children these days, it is almost like night and day between those who have fathers who are actively involved in their family and those who do not. A critical piece in putting the puzzle back together is to restore reverence for fatherhood in our family circles. So much of the violence and drug abuse in our world today flows from the lack of discipline and direction that is the role of the father.
