My Friends,

There are so many opportunities available this time of year to express our gratitude. On this Veteran's Day weekend, I would suggest that we thank the veterans among our families and friends who have sacrificed so much to protect our freedom. A contribution to the Wounded Warriors' Project would certainly be appropriate.

In this month of November we also take up a collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development. The purpose of the faith-based involvement is to provide a support group that builds self-confidence and self-esteem. Maybe they need a tutor to develop their reading skills. Maybe they need some practical advice and encouragement. I would like to form a group that could be a resource to help people whatever there need is, to become productive and self-sufficient workers.
